## **ADHD**

Do you know parents / carers of a child who is in the diagnostic process for ADHD?

A Pre-ADHD Diagnosis Pilot Group will be running in May. It is three sessions of two hours to be held at The Riverside Centre. The aims of these sessions are to:

- an introduction to ADHD
- a parental perspective
- opportunities for participants to explore and share together the emotional impacts on themselves and the family
- · identifying priorities and sharing ideas for strategies
- linking the scheme of work for the ADHD Parent Factor programme and where appropriate signposting to other supports and services.
