

CCTV on the school site

Further to me informing parents at the start of term that we would be installing CCTV on the school site, I can confirm that our cameras will go live as of Monday 2nd December. We have uploaded our CCTV policy onto the school website and have appropriate signage inside and around the school site itself, informing people where the cameras are sited. I would like to make parents aware that there is no visible monitor showing constantly streamed images around the school site, anywhere visible. We have a control room where only authorised staff may view the CCTV images, and I can confirm that this would only be done as and when there was ever a need to look at these, should there ever be an incident which required us to access the images.

Solar panels and our Eco Warriors

school roof. Last week, we had a visit from two surveyors who met with our Eco Warriors after inspecting our school roof for the suitability for solar panels.
