child to learn to play the keyboard, please contact Mrs Boyd in the school office thank you.




## RE celebration

#### No levels - assessment

In September, the Government changed the way that we assess childrens' progress in schools, when they removed the system of 'levels' for describing a child's attainment. Each school is able to devise their own system of assessment and measures of progress, and this means that in the future there will be no nationally agreed system of measuring pupils' levels of attainment.
