Bikeability Year 3 & 4

This Thursday and Friday, Year 3 and 4 are taking part in Bikeability Level 1. During Level 1 Bikeability training, children learn to control and master their bike. The training takes place in an environment away from cars or traffic - in our playground. The children will be trained in groups of 15. Once the children have completed their Bikeability Level 1 and been awarded their red badge, they will be able to:

- Fit their own helmet
- Carry out a simple bike check
- Get on their bike, start cycling, then stop and get off
- Ride their bike using the gears
- Make their bike go where you want it to, including moving around objects safely

- Control the bike with one hand
- Stop quickly if you need to
- Look all around you when they're riding, including behind, without wobbling. Since JSCHS have their own small number of bikes, they will be on loan to school for the two days, so that if someone has an issue with their own bike, we have spares for the children to use. Mrs Monaghan and Mrs Udberg will be writing with further organisational details for parents.
