Basketball

As Storm Arwen raged across the North East, children from Preston Grange Primary School stormed the court at the Vertu Motors Arena. Children from Year 4, 5 and 6 had the unique opportunity to take part in an intra-school basketball competition on the same court that was about to host a battle between the Newcastle Eagles and Sheffield Sharks, their bitter rivals in the struggle to win the British Basketball League. The teams were treated to a pre-game motivational speech from Kieron Achara, a former Olympic and BBL basketball star. Once on the court, all teams showed fierce determination to win and all 16 games were noted for their closeness and display of basketball skill. It was clear that all involved wanted a chance to play at half-time in front of a stadium of fans.

The successful teams rose magnificently to the challenge of playing to such a huge, basketball-loving crowd but an early basket from Ruban Badhwal ensured there was a clear winning team.

As well as the opportunity to play, children and their families experienced a topflight basketball game in a sold-out arena and soaked up the atmosphere of a game played by athletes in their prime. It was a fantastic experience for children, families and staff alike and one we look forward to repeating in the Newcastle Eagles' annual Hoops 4 Health competition where Preston Grange will be able to test their mettle against other schools.

School meals

Please see below, some information from Catering Services regarding school meals:

All children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 are eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals. Unless you are eligible for benefit-based free school meals you will need to pay for school lunches from the start of Year 3. School meals are great value at only £2.25 a day. School meals should be paid for:

- online using ParentPay website
- before they are taken
- preferable a week in advance

Paying online means that you can do this at a time that's convenient for you. Pay for school meals online at <u>www.parentpay.com</u> To set up a ParentPay account you require an activation username and password, which can be sent to you by email or letter.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - PARENTPAY is managed by North Tyneside Council Catering Services, not your child's school. Please ignore any advice on the Parent-Pay website, where it asks you to contact your school. Please email your query to <u>parentpay@northtyneside.gov.uk</u> Please ensure you include your child's name and school in your email.
