Illness

At school, we follow the guidelines of the school public health nurses. There is a specific amount of time that a child must be off school following specific illnesses. For example, please note that if your child has been sick, they must remain off school for a full 48 hour period after their last sickness. If they are sent into school before this, then the office will ring parents and send the child home. This is to prevent the sickness spreading to other children and staff.





Swimming

Year 4 go swimming each week and we have been asked to point out to parents that if your child has a verruca, they must have it covered at all times, and wear a verruca sock in the swimming pool to prevent further children catching a verruca.

In relation to swimming, all children who attend school must go swimming each week. I am afraid that we are unable to leave behind and supervise children in school who are not well, nor are we able to supervise them at the baths if they are not well.
