The children will be taking part in Science, Personal Social Health Education and healthy living activities in the afternoons of that week, and on the Wednesday we will be having a sponsored sports event (more details to follow from Mr Burgess). On the last day of that week for the children (Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May), we will be having our Sports Day afternoon from 1-3pm. This is a change from when we have previously have done this in July - at least this date in May gives us plenty of time to reschedule, if the weather is bad.

#### Forest School

We are working with Mark Stutt from ScoutEd over the next 6 months in school. Mark is a Forest School leader, and he delivers courses both in school and at Kirkley Hall in order to inspire children's love of outdoor learning. We have arranged for each class to spend a day up at Kirkley Hall with Mark leading forest school activities for the children. Then, in Autumn term, Mark will be working in school with each class, linking the topic that the children are doing, with forest school skills. Finally, in the second half of Summer term, Mark will be running a Forest School after-school club each week, which will include activities such as: environmental art, story-telling, model making, fire making, toasting marshmallows and making hot chocolate.

# Penguin Pig E-Safety show

Tomorrow there will be a theatre company in school. The company will present the Penguin Pig E-Safety show to Reception, Year 1 and 2, and then they will deliver interactive workshops for each class. The aim of the puppet based show, is to teach young children about safety on the internet. The fun-filled show is for EYFS and KS1, and is based on the best-selling picture book by Lincolnshire author and teacher Stuart Spendlow. The play is told with puppetry and catchy songs, but has an important safety message for the children. Please ask your child about the show afterwards. We are sure that they are going to enjoy the play, whilst also learning about internet safety.
