Parent survey

A huge thank you to all of our parents for completing the recent parent surveys. We were really pleased that such a significant number of our families participated in the survey. For your information, we are sending home to parents the findings from the survey and a copy of the parent comments. The results were overwhelmingly positive, and we thank you very much for your honest and valuable feedback. The company who analyse the survey for our school, commented that our parent comments are the best that they have read to date in the six years they have been working on school self-evaluation!

I would like to thank the staff and Governors for their constant hard work, commitment and dedication to our school, and the school community and parents for the fantastic support that we receive. We are also grateful for any feedback that you give as it helps us continue to improve, and should you have any further queries please do not hesitate to ask.

In analysing the survey, we found that the following question, the majority of parents answered as 'neither agree nor disagree': 'the school gives my child information on how to deal with such things as alcohol and drugs. This made us realise that perhaps we had not explained how this particular matter (drugs and alcohol education) is taught across school. As a result of this, we have tried to explain some examples of how this is taught, below. For information, our curriculum may be found on our website www.prestongrangeprimary.co.uk under the 'about' section. Should you have any specific questions about any aspect of the curriculum or how something is taught in school, please ask your child's class teacher.

• Drugs and Alcohol Education

At Preston Grange we deliver the curriculum content for drugs and alcohol education in different ways. Our main aim is to deliver curriculum content at age appropriate levels either through our class based topic work or through our 'castles' time. For example, in Year 2 science, children identify drugs in the context of medicines, and how they can help to keep us healthy. The children learn about how medicines should be stored, how to stay safe around them and how they can be dangerous. Within the Year 6 science curriculum, children are taught to recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function. Alcohol and drugs awareness is built into this science topic.

We would also like to explain one of the valid points raised under the parent comment section:

The time that the school bell rings

In the morning at our school, the bell rings at 9am. We don't ring it at 8.55am for a 9am start, because the start time of the school day depends on the timings of the rest of the school day. For example, our home time bell goes at 3.30pm, which is later than most primary schools. At some schools, their bell goes before 9am but their home time may be 3.20pm. It is also dependent on whether there are playtimes in the morning and afternoon, how long these are, and how long lunchtime is. That is the reason that our school day starts at 9am.

We did however find that our bell (which is a digital/electronic bell) was set two minutes late. This has now been corrected and we hope that this has tightened up our timings. Finally, once the bell rings at 9am and the staff are on the yard, please feel free to leave your child/children at that point. Please don't feel that you need to wait until your child's line has gone into school.
