School Improvement Partner Summer report

Every term, a School Improvement Officer from the Local Authority visits all schools in the Local Authority to review the progress and standards in schools. These are a few comments from our July report:

'The school has a core set of values at its heart. These include respectfulness, good manners and thoughtfulness and are continually reinforced through whole-school assemblies and the excellent modelling of positive behaviours by staff.'

In writing ...'teacher assessments show that 33% of pupils reached the higher level 5 in Writing and one pupil (3%) performed exceptionally well to reach level 6. This represents improvement of 15% on last year's level 5 results and is the first time a pupil at the school has achieved level 6. All pupils made the expected two levels of progress from their Key Stage 1 assessments in Year 2; 27% of pupils exceeded this and made three whole levels of progress. This compares favourably with the national average..'

'The school continues to improve with visible impact from the initiatives undertaken across the year. Higher levels of pupil achievement, a more consistent quality of teaching that is never less than good, and a strengthened leadership team across the school ensures that there is a very strong capacity to improve further...'

Results from Summer assessments

We are delighted with how well our children performed in recent assessments and tests at Year 1 (phonics) and Year 6 end of Key Stage 2 tests in the Summer term. The Year 1 phonics pass rate nationally was 57% (2012), the Local Authority pass rate was 72.9%, whilst our school pass rate was significantly higher at 85%.

In Year 6, the national expected level for children to achieve at the end of Key Stage 2 is a Level 4. This year 3.3% of our Year 6 class achieved a Level 6 in Writing, 3.3% achieved a Level 6 in Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar and 6.7% children achieved Level 6 in Maths. These are the first level 6's our school has ever achieved, and we are proud of this achievement.

Hit the Surf!

Last week our Year 5 and 6 children spent a morning down at Tynemouth Longsands, with the RNLI lifeguards. The aim of the day was to teach the children beach and water safety. The children in Year 5 had a very windy day, but nothing stopped their enthusiasm for the activities, which saw them surf boarding, rescuing their friend in the sea and learning about keeping safe in the sea. Year 6 had better weather for the morning and also had a fantastic morning with the lifeguards. Here are some photos from the day:









Leave of absence requests

Following the first newsletter of the term I said that I would clarify the position as to leave of absence during term time for children. The government has made changes to the 2006 regulations in the Education Pupil Registration Regulations 2013 Act. These amendments, came into force on 1 September 2013.

Up until September 1st 2013, the regulations allowed headteachers to grant leave of absence for the purpose of a family holiday during term time in "special circumstances" of up to ten school days leave per year. Headteachers could also grant extended leave for more than ten school days in exceptional circumstances.

However the recent amendments to the 2006 regulations remove references to family holiday and extended leave, as well as the statutory threshold of ten school days. The amendments make clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. As a result of the amendments, our 'holiday request form' will be re-named 'leave of absence request' and there will be slight changes to the form. Term time holiday will be authorised only under exceptional circumstances.

Some of you may be aware, that some schools within our pyramid, have not been authorising family term time holidays for some time. As Head I have tried to be fair, used my discretion and in some cases have authorised up to ten days authorised holiday in a year. Unfortunately I now have to revise leave of absence requests in line with National and Local practice. When a form is submitted now, I am only able to authorise the holiday if there are 'exceptional circumstances'. Any leave of absence which is not authorised will

be coded as 'unauthorised holiday' on the register. I am aware that the cost of family holidays is far higher during the school holidays, I also appreciate that parents can't always get school holidays off work. I am however expected to apply the new regulations, although I will still use my discretion within the scope I am allowed. Thank you for your support with this matter, if you have any concerns or worries please come and talk to me.

Cycling in school grounds

This week there was an accident due to a child cycling in the school grounds. We ask all children and parents not to ride bikes until they reach the school gates. We would be grateful for all bikes to be pushed on the path, not grass, so that there are no further accidents. Thank you for your support with this matter.

CCTV

We are always looking to improve the security on our school site for the safety of our children and staff, and I am pleased to inform you that this week we are having CCTV fitted throughout the whole school site.

Your orders help the school as we get 20% of the order to spend on books for school. All orders must be handed into the school office by Friday 27th September.
