# Reading at home Year 3 & 4

We have been disappointed in speaking to our Year 3 and 4 children to find that many of them are not reading books at home. We used to have a system where we asked for an adult signature each time when the children had read, but chose to move away from this system as we



wanted the children to read for pleasure and hoped that they would do this of their own accord, and take responsibility for reading themselves. We also introduced a new reward system to motivate the children. We would prefer not to have to return to the system of an adult signature each day, but we need your help to do this. We ask that at home, you support us in getting your child to pick up a book and read it for even 15 minutes a night. As well as having stories read to them, they should be independently reading every night, either aloud to parents or to themselves.

If your child reads from the reading scheme, they do still need to be reading every night, and if they are on free readers, then they should be enjoying reading their own choice of book. If they aren't, then they haven't chosen the right book. We ask that you work with us to help engage the children in reading, and we will review this with the children again in two weeks before deciding whether to return to the previous system or not. We will of course be talking to the children about them enjoying books and taking responsibility for reading their books themselves, especially with our new reading reward scheme.

#### Scholastic books

#### After school clubs

All after school clubs run for 6 weeks. On Mondays it is Curling club, on Thursdays it is 'Big board game bonanza' club and on Fridays, there is Amazing Artists club. All clubs run from 3.30-4.30pm, except Judo which runs until 4.35pm. Please note, all children who attend an after school club must be collected by an adult.

#### PE this term

Each half term we get specialist PE input from Mr Pilkington from John Spence, who teaches specific year groups ahead of competitions or events. The class teachers observe and work alongside Mr Pilkington during these lessons. This half term he is working in Year 1 and 2 teaching multi-skills, and teaching Year 6 hockey.

On March 6<sup>th</sup>, Year 2 will be performing in the North Tyneside Dance Festival at The Parks at 6pm. Information and tickets to follow.

#### Show Racism the Red Card

#### Career speed dating

On 7<sup>th</sup> February, we have arranged a 'career speed dating' event for our Year 5 and 6 children. This has been arranged through North Tyneside Learning Trust, who have organised ten different employers to come into school. The children will have devised a series of questions for each employer, and they will move around the hall, getting 5 minutes with each employer, with the aim of working out what their job is.

We think that the children will learn a great deal about the world of work - which too often is left until Secondary school for them to find out. In the meantime, Mr Burgess and Miss

Daley will talk to their classes about three jobs in our school and what the children think the jobs entail. We would be grateful if your child is in Year 5 or 6 that you please talk to your child about what your job is, what it entails and what skills you require to be able to do your job. # ICT developments

When we opened the Nursery we used the room that was the ICT suite. We have no spsare room to set up another ICT suite unfortunately, but we have since invested in 16 laptops and a charger trolley in addition to the ipads that we have in school, in order for the children to be able to access the Computing curriculum. Over the holidays, we have also invested in a new wi-fi network in school and have connected the mobile classroom and after school club to the wi-fi network, as well as installing interactive whiteboards in the small group intervention rooms we use. We are really pleased with these improvements to our ICT in school, as they will benefit the children and their learning.
