Mnemonics

Following a successful parent workshop with the Dyslexia Team, it was requested that it would be helpful if we shared with parents, the mnemonics that we teach across school to in order to help the children to spell a certain word. I am pleased to attach a list of mnemonics we use across school. There are photos to explain how we help children with 'b' and 'd' reversals, and prompts for how we teach children to remember certain key spellings. Thank you to staff for compiling the list in a format to share with parents, and we hope that you find it useful.

Operation Christmas Child

Each year we participate in Operation Christmas Child, which is a charity that appeals for people to donate shoeboxes filled with gifts, for a child in another part of the world. Please find attached an information leaflet about the Shoebox Appeal. It includes information about age categories and what you may put in your shoebox. If you would like to donate a shoebox, we would need them to be returned to school during the first week back after October half term: by Friday 8th November, for collection by the charity. Today the children learnt about the appeal in assembly, and were pleased to learn that your shoebox is trackable, meaning that the children are now able to find out which country their shoe box has been sent to. I am sure they will tell you all about the appeal themselves. Many thanks for your continued support.
