# Family fun day

I would like to give parents advanced notice of a fantastic family fun day. This is an event organised by Tynemouth and Whitley Bay Scout Groups of which Jonny (Year 4) and his brother are members. The money raised is going to help a group of 35 young people, take the trip of a lifetime to Hiroshima to do community work to mark the 75th anniversary of the Hiroshima bomb. Jonny's brother James was lucky enough to be selected to take the trip. Part of the experience is that the young people must actively participate in fundraising and organise events for the benefit of the community in the build up to the trip. The family fun day is on June 28<sup>th</sup> from 11am till 4pm at Rockliffe RFC in Whitley Bay. There will be activities such as a climbing tower, a bouncy castle, an inflatable slide, birds of prey, a children's carousel, pony rides, archery, laser quest, tea cups and much more. ## Pupil pass

We are going to start a new system for when parents request to take their child out of school for a medical appointment. Firstly, we would ask that parents make medical appointments after school at best, or during the later part of the school day if possible. Please inform the office as usual that your child has an appointment, but when you come to collect your child, we have a new signing out book (a pupil pass book) which allows us to give parents the top copy when the child is taken out for an appointment, and the time they are taken and returned to school is then recorded on the school copy. This system will start after half term, from June 3<sup>rd</sup>.

# Healthy School status

We are pleased to inform parents that we have maintained our Healthy School status, following assessment last week by Elaine Robson, School Improvement Adviser for North Tyneside. Every four years, schools who have been awarded Healthy Schools status, have to carry out a health check or audit in all 4 of the areas which



the Healthy Schools programme covers, in order to maintain the status of being a healthy school: Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE), Healthy Eating, Physical Activity and Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health (EWMH). Following a review of these areas of the curriculum, staff training and a re-draft of our Sex Relationships Education curriculum, Elaine Robson met with two children from each class as part of the assessment which she carried out. She also met with Miss Knowles, PSHE subject leader on several occasions, before informing us that we had maintained our Healthy School status. We are delighted that we have achieved the Healthy School status once again, and thank Miss Knowles for her hard work and enthusiasm in leading us through the re-validation process.

#### SATs

This week our Year 6 children are sitting their end of Key Stage 2 SATs. We all wish them luck. Thank you to all of the parents for your support and hard work at home with the children in the lead up to the SATs.
