# Joinos - On-line School Meal payment

We would encourage all our parents to register on Joinos (www.joinos.com). Joinos allows you to manage your school meal account on-line, see the days your child stayed for lunch, pay for meals online by debit/credit card, view the menu and receive information from our catering service team in relation to free school meals. Pupils who are not yet registered will be bringing home registration code letters to enable parents to access this site. We would like to reduce the amount of cash being brought into school and would therefore encourage all our parents to pay on-line if possible, please use your registration code to access the website.

#### **Y5** Young Leaders

Adam Pilkington, Sports leader from John Spence Community High School is a regular visitor to our school and forges very good links between Preston Grange and the feeder school. Presently he is working with Y5 pupils, training them in the skills to become Young Leaders.

This includes skills around organisation, planning, discipline and assertiveness. These attributes are already emerging after only 2 weeks of coaching. Further sessions before the summer holidays should really see Year 5 blossom.

#### Year 4 Robinwood residential

For Year 4 parents, I would like to confirm the arrangements for Monday morning. We would be grateful if you could arrive at



school with your child and their luggage, but *not before 8.45am*, as staff will be in a briefing meeting. If your child is dropped off at breakfast club, their luggage will need to be left with Mr Conaty in breakfast club. At 8.45am, Mrs Udberg will let parents into the hall, after we have moved breakfast club into the ICT suite. There will be 'stations' or tables in the hall staffed by Mrs Udberg, Mr Jamison and Mrs Brown: a bag drop (which needs a Robinwood luggage label, handed to you on the morning), a table for dropping off £2 tuck shop money (which must be in a named sealed envelope thanks) and a table for dropping off medicines. We would ask that all of your child's luggage is inside their bag, and that there are no items (including teddy) to carry by hand or tied to the outside of the luggage. This makes it easier for the children to carry their own luggage at the other end when they have to walk the last part of the way to Robinwood. Once you have dropped off your child and their luggage, the children will be directed to the classroom. Please feel free at this point to wait outside beside the coach parked outside school, where you will be able to wave off your child when they leave at 9.20am.
