#### Hallowe'en spooktacular disco

#### PE kit

We have found that since the beginning of this term, there are several children without PE kit each week in school. This way, parents don't need to worry about remembering the days of the week that children have PE, and also it doesn't matter if the day changes for unforeseen circumstances or timetable changes if children have their kit in school each week.
