#### After school club

Due to Schools Out Northern no longer providing an out of school club at our school after Friday 9th July, we are currently considering if running an after school club would be a viable option for school or not. We are required to draw up a business plan and work out if the low numbers currently attending (averaging 5 children per night) could be supported.

During the last week of the term (week beginning July 12th) school unfortunately will not be able to support the families of children who currently access out of school club. Parents will have to make alternative arrangements for childcare, as there are no staff in school to cover this. If you are having difficulty finding alternative childcare for the last week, perhaps you might approach Schools Out Northern to ask if they will consider opening in the last week.

To outline the situation, schools can provide access to wraparound childcare, but only *if there is sufficient demand*, either on their own premises or nearby, but it is not a statutory requirement. We are keen to consider some alternative options and will inform parents as soon as we know if it is a viable option.

# Appointments in the school day

In line with our attendance policy (see website) parents are expected to make appointments for children outside of the school day wherever possible, particularly with routine check-up appointments. As well as monitoring attendance, we are now monitoring the increasing number of children who attend appointment during the school day. Recently there has been an increase in these, particularly on Fridays, and so I ask again that parents use school holidays, and make appointments outside of the school day. Thank you for your support with this matter.
