Breakfast club for Nursery children

Governors decided that our main school breakfast club would not be suitable for the youngest children in school, with the older children and the numbers already in there, but we are delighted to have come to an arrangement with our pre-school Nursery. We are pleased to inform parents that as of September, there will be a breakfast club specifically for Nursery children in the pre-school Nursery from 7.45am until 8.45am. At the end of the session, a member of staff will take the Nursery children over to our school Nursery. Each session will cost £2.50, and will be run by our pre-school Nursery. Parents will have to book their child's place one week ahead in order to ensure the 1:8 ratio is planned for. We are grateful for them offering this service for our working parents, and hope that the breakfast club will be popular with our Nursery parents. A letter will be sent out to all parents of Nursery children in order to find out the initial interest for the breakfast club, as we hope that there will be sufficient numbers to make this viable.
