Grow To Eat

Following on from the success of A Splash of Colour, NTLT's intergenerational art project, I am excited to share with parents the first details of a brand new project which continues to develop meaningful intergenerational connections in our community.

Grow to Eat continues to work with North Tyneside Living schemes but this time the focus is on shared connections through the growing and eating of fruit and vegetables.

This is a new venture and we are thrilled that our Year 2 children will be taking part in this exciting project.

Unlike A Splash of Colour Intergenerational which all took place at Tamar Court retirement home, this project will run on a hybrid model with some visits and in-school work too. Please see the video on our Twitter account for more information about the project (@pg primary)

We feel that by taking part in projects that involve the children working collaboratively with elderly residents from a retirement home, it offers children a wide range of valuable benefits. It helps them develop empathy, respect, and understanding for older generations, breaking down stereotypes and fostering a sense of community connection.

Through shared activities and conversations, children gain insight into the past, learning from the residents' experiences, stories, and life skills. These interactions can also build children's confidence, communication skills, and social awareness, while providing a sense of purpose and belonging. Overall, such projects enrich children's personal development, promote kindness, and strengthen links between the school and the wider community.

We are really excited about working with Tamar Court residents once again in the Spring term!

London visit to Parliament

IMPORTANT advanced notice - pantomime

This year's whole-school trip to the pantomime will follow a clear procedure to ensure the safety and smooth running of the visit. All children are expected to return to school on the coach after the performance, rather than a few individuals being collected directly from the theatre.

Last year, handing individual children over to parents at the venue caused significant disruption and safety concerns, as staff must supervise around 200 pupils. For the purposes of the risk assessment, head counts, and allocated coach seating, every child must travel

back to school with their class before being collected by parents/carers at the agreed pick up location outside Morrisons near school. *Please note there are no exceptions to this.*

PE kit reminder

Please ensure that your child brings their PE kit to school. PE is an important part of the curriculum, and all children take part in two PE sessions each week. If a child does not have their own kit, they will be provided with a spare one from school. To avoid this, please make sure your child's PE kit is kept in school at all times and only taken home when it needs to be washed. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us ensure all pupils are prepared and able to fully participate in their PE lessons.
