Class attendance

Our target attendance is 96.5%. Whilst we appreciate that children are sometimes unwell, we ask that absence is kept to an absolute minimum so that children aren't missing learning. Please see below the class attendance for last week. As you can see, there are only 4 classes with attendance over our school target and there is no class with 100% attendance.

As well as class attendance figures, we monitor individual attendance. If your child's attendance falls below our target percentage, you will receive a series of letters which now escalate very quickly if attendance does not improve and sometimes it generates Education Welfare Officer involvement.

Reception - 91.3%

Year 1 - 98.5%

Year 2 - 92.3%

Year 3 - 94.3%

Year 4 - 97.2%

Year 5 - 97.4%

Year 6 - 97.3%

Lateness

We also track and monitor children who arrive at school later than 9am, since lateness means lost learning. Please see below the impact of children being late for school:

5 mins late each day = 3 days lost learning over a year

10 mins late each day = 6.5 days lost learning over a year

15 mins late each day = 10 days lost learning over a year (2 school weeks equivalent)

20 mins late each day = 13 days lost learning over a year

30 mins late each day = 19 days lost learning over a year (equivalent of 4 school weeks across the year)

Lateness and absence will affect your child's attainment and progress at school, and the number of days a child is missing across a year will also affect their chances of success.

All children should be on the school yard for 8.55am, ready in their line for the bell at 9am. If your child arrives late, you will need to deliver them into school and give a reason as to why they are late. The child is given a 'late card' which goes to the class teacher, and then they record the late arrival on the register under a separate code. We would be grateful if parents would ensure that all children are in school at the correct time, to avoid any procedures that we have to follow if lateness becomes an issue.

If your child is absent for any reason, parents are expected to phone the school office by 9.15am to report the absence and **the reason**. This avoids the office staff having to contact parents, although we do not expect to have to do this. If your child is absent for more than 2 days, you are expected to phone again on the 3rd day to advise when your child will likely return. Thank you for your support with these matters.

Term time holidays

In 2013, amendments were made to the Attendance Regulations by the Department of Education. Headteachers are not able to grant term time holiday or any term time absence unless there are *exceptional circumstances*. If leave of absence is taken without permission from the Headteacher, it will be marked as unauthorised. Under these Government regulations, any attendance marked as unauthorised can lead to the involvement of the Education Welfare Service in cases of poor attendance.

Once your child is registered at school, parents are legally responsible for making sure they attend regularly. This means your child should not have sessions of unauthorised absence.

It is the first year that we have had so many children on holiday in the first three weeks of a new school year. This will greatly affect children's learning at this key time of the school year, and we ask that parents avoid taking children out of school at this important time in future. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Applying for a Reception or High school place

Our school office recently sent out information about applying for a place in either Reception or High School for September 2018. The Local Authority ask that parents complete the application online, by visiting www.northtyneside.gov.uk and following the link to online school applications. Please note, if you are not completing the form online and you choose to complete a paper application, this MUST be returned by the deadline date to North Tyneside Access Team, not to school.

Online applications are now available and online admissions will close for a High School place on 27th October 2017, and online admissions for a Reception place will close on 12th January 2018.

Please note: if your child is currently in our school Nursery, this does not guarantee your child a place in our Reception class.

Earrings and PE reminder

Firstly, we appreciate that if you were going to have your child's ears pierced, you waited until the 6 weeks holiday. However, please note that as part of our school policy, earrings must be removed for all PE lessons. Please help your child learn how to remove and replace their earrings independently. Staff are unable to assist children with this. We do not allow children to cover their earrings with tape or plasters due to health issues caused by restricting airflow to the piercing. This is based on advice from the Local Authority. If a child cannot remove their earrings, they will be given non-active roles in lessons until they are able to remove and replace the earrings independently. Thank you for your support.

Mrs Lawrence and Mrs Godfrey have requested that all parents send a pair of wellies into school as soon as possible, for the children to use for outdoor learning. Please make sure that these are both labelled inside with your child's name thank you. Current reception will be sent home tonight with their wellies from last year in Nursery.
