# New payment system

Last week you should have received a letter about our new online payment system for paying for swimming, school trips etc. If you haven't received this letter, please contact the school office. For your information, our new system goes live as from tomorrow (Wed 3<sup>rd</sup> May). We know from feedback, that this will be preferable to parents and more convenient to be able to pay online. If a payment is due, you will receive a text which gives you a link to follow to make payment. Swimming will need to be paid for each week on our new system.

## School uniform

For years, school uniform has been ordered via school and cash payments have been the only method of payment that is accepted. This year we intend to change this to make it more convenient for parents. You will be able to order the children's uniform and collect direct from Emblematic paying by any form of payment, or you can order the uniform online and it can be delivered. It also means that you will be able to try the sizes on your child and also call up to Emblematic at your convenience at any time during Summer. We hope that you find this more convenient.

# Twitter, website and newsletters

Over this academic year we have changed the way in which we communicate news from school. Whereas in the past, staff took photos which were then uploaded to our network and shared via our school website or a small number were added to the newsletter. Since September, we have used Twitter as a constant newsfeed from school, and staff now use iPads for taking photos. Galleries of photos aren't therefore uploaded to our network, so there may be a wider range of ongoing photos but not necessarily galleries of the same event on the website. This means that there is a wider range of events and news able to be shared with parents.

## Sports Day - advanced notice

This year we have planned Sports Day for Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June, as this fits in with School Sports Week. Sports day will start at 1pm and we hope that by holding it this early, it will hopefully allow us to be able to rearrange the afternoon if we have bad weather.

## Nursery places

We are delighted that our Nursery numbers are so good, and we can confirm that the Nursery is now full for 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 has limited spaces. Please note that if you apply for a place, all applications are acknowledged in writing, with either an offer or turned down if we are full for that cohort.

The procedure is as follows: parents that receive an offer then must return an acceptance slip that is sent out, by the date given. It has come to our attention that some people have been informing the office that they have handed in their applications. This does not guarantee a place, and our system is very thorough and all forms are logged as soon as they are sent into school. There are no places offered without the procedure outlined above.
