We are always encouraging reading at home. By reading with your child, you help cultivate a lasting love of reading. But did you know that reading for pleasure can help prevent conditions such as stress, depression and dementia?

The conversations children have at home and, especially, hearing stories read aloud play a significant role in success at school (and beyond too). MRI scans show increased brain activity in children whose parents read **with** them regularly. Reading builds brains; it's that simple.
