Wear it red day – February is National Heart Month

This Friday, we are having a non-uniform day and asking the children to come into school wearing red. February is National Heart Month, and we will be fundraising for North East Hearts with Goals, a local charity (<u>http://www.nehwg.co.uk/#wel-come</u> and <u>https://www.facebook.com/NEHEARTSWITHGOALS/</u>) North East Hearts with Goals are a north east charity run by locals Christine Stephenson and Kelly Best. They are driven by the loss of Kelly's husband and Christine's brother, Neil, from a sudden cardiac arrest. They help raise funding for life saving defibrillators.

This charity has placed over 450 defibrillators across the north east. This has helped save over 30 lives!! Indeed funding from this charity allowed our own school to acquire a defibrillator several years ago. The charity also provide CPR and defibrillator awareness and training. They also support local families who have children with heart conditions by providing defibrillators ongoing support.

This Friday, we will have Simon Brown in school to teach the children across school basic CPR. Simon is our football coach and husband of Mrs Brown, Teaching Assistant, and someone who also suffered a sudden cardiac arrest several years ago but luckily due to people standing by being able to administer CPR, he survived. Simon currently volunteers to help North East Hearts for Goals, in order to help fundraise and raise awareness of CPR and using defibrillators.

Some facts about cardiac arrest:

- Sudden Cardiac Arrest is the UK's biggest killer
- 100,000 people die a year
- 25 young people every week
- Only 8% of people who have an SCA survive!
- If a defibrillator is used, it can increase survival chances to 80%

Please help us move our defibrillator

Following on from this Friday's fundraising effort for North East Hearts for Goals, we would like to further fundraise in order to move our school defibrillator from its current position in the entrance of school, to outside on our school gate posts. In this way it will be far more accessible to the whole community.

I know that in the Summer holidays 2020, there were 3 requests to use the defibrillator over the Summer holidays, one from Redesdale, and the other two times, families in the local community, having called the emergency services were sent to



our school as it was the nearest defibrillator. It was pure chance that there were workmen and myself in school at that time, but there are 13 weeks of the school year that school is closed, so being inside our school it is not as accessible to everyone as it could be.

In order to move the defibrillator from its current place, we will need to raise a further amount of money to be able to buy a different type of defibrillator exterior cabinet and install it. We would be extremely grateful for the support of our families in helping us raise this money, and I will speak to the Friends of Preston Grange to see if we can plan some fundraising events before the end of Summer term with this in mind.
